# About Me

I made a horrible choice in 2006 that caused my life to veer way off course. Because of this, I'm a registered sex offender. But that is not who I truly am. Though I take full responsibility for my poor choices, I'm not my crime. Sure, society and courts have labeled me a felon and a sex offender. But I'm also a father, business owner, a dog dad, a former TV weatherman and radio host, and someone who has compassion and empathy for others.

Now that I've been out of prison since 2012, I've focused my attention on bettering myself and developing ways I can help others that have lived through similar challenges. From 2013 to 2017, I produced five independent films with topics ranging from Tourette Syndrome to the lack of rental housing for ex-felons and registered sex offenders. More recently, I've become more vocal through my website, podcast, and vlog, [The Outspoken Offender](#). My new venture is about social ostracism and the effects of long-term rejection. Studies have shown that rejection can have disastrous consequences in the form of anger and aggression. I also help registered citizens, former inmates, and anyone else move beyond stereotypes and rejection from society, friends, and family.

## YouTube Channel

As a former TV news anchor, I understand the power of video and film. It has the capability of spreading rumors, exaggerated information, fear, and conspiracy theories. On the other hand, if done correctly, a video creates truth, compassion, and understanding.

My YouTube channel, [The Outspoken Offender](#), speaks to people that have either been affected by the criminal justice system, or who live their lives as outcasts according to their communities. It's not all gloom and doom though. My vlog discusses ways people can overcome society's rejection plus tips for living a healthier life and healing from the past.

[My podcast](#) is an extension of my YouTube channel in a short-form, positive format. Instead of long interviews, I create 5-10 minute episodes that are educational and uplifting. I enjoy utilizing my past experience in broadcast radio to remind people that they are not alone when struggling with rejection.

Most of my listeners are individuals or families affected by the sex offender registry or former incarceration. They face employment and housing restrictions, hate from their communities, and deal with ostracism from families and friends.

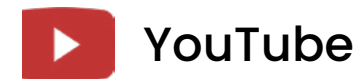
